General/Personal Statement:

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to have been NZEI Te Riu Roa National President for the past two years. When I first stood for election, I anticipated that this would be for a one-year term, yet here I am – accepting a nomination for a third year.

This is a significant change in custom and practice for our organisation but one that enough of my National Executive colleagues have suggested is worthy of my consideration. As members expect, the National Executive is aware that it needs to ensure a strong succession plan is in place. Over the past two years, the plan around ensuring the Vice-President is ready to take on this challenging role has been designed to ensure that we will be well served when the change is made. Our VP has signalled that his need to commit to his school in 2010 will mean that he is unable to stand for the role of president in the timeframe he had intended.

In times that are uncertain and full of change the need for continuity and strong leadership within our organisation is paramount. We have many challenges and potential changes ahead in the next year not only within our own organisation as we grapple with constitutional change but in the wider context as well. The political changes at government level mean NZEI has had to work strategically in forming important new relationships that will ensure the members' voices are heard at the appropriate time and in the right forum.

I have accepted this nomination with the full knowledge and support of my school and my Board of Trustees. As active members you will judge my fitness to seek this role for a third term on what you know of my skills and leadership over the past two years - the decision is one for Annual Meeting to make.

I trained in the seventies at both Ardmore and Auckland Teachers' Colleges, with two years out in between working on a factory floor. I spent a year teaching followed by a further year at College training to teach Deaf students. I then taught at Kelston School for the Deaf until moving to Turangi where I taught New Entrants! This was a period of the most rewarding teaching of my career and coincided with my sons entering primary education. In 1990 I bought an old teachers' hostel in Turangi and turned it into a backpackers. In 1991 I left full time teaching to enter the world of private enterprise. Background:

I am a primary trained teacher who began my career in the junior area of a full primary school in Dunedin and later became appointed to the position of Assistant Principal at the same school. In 1997 I was awarded study leave to attend Whakapiki I Te Reo Immersion course for 20 weeks which was hosted by Waikato University. In 1998 I was seconded by the Ministry of Education into the position of Resource Teacher of Māori and then was appointed permanently in 1999.

Since that time I have had extensive national experience in the area of Māori education including appointments on Ministry of Education working parties to develop Exemplars, visiting lecturer positions to the Hoaka Pounamu course, Co convenor and presenter for the Teachers' Refresher Course He Mātai Mātātīpu and graduated from Ngā Taumatua training in 2003 as a Specialist Teacher for Literacy in Māori immersion education.

In 2009 I was asked to take up the position of Principal at Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Otepoti and which I have agreed to for the period of twelve months. This is currently a teaching principal position and I have welcomed the opportunity to return to the classroom firstly as a teacher but also as member of the teaching profession committed to providing high quality programmes for our students.

I am a proud and committed member of NZEI and I relish all opportunities to engage in union activity whether that be at a local or national level.
